Progressive Discipline:



Classroom

1. verbal warning
2. student's name on board
3. check behind the name on board
(final verbal warning)
4. Second check behind name
(student disciplinary action form)



Playground

1. Verbal warning
2. Time-out (2 minutes)
3. Time-out (5 minutes)
4. Disciplinary action form

Following the third disciplinary action form filed with our office, an administrative conference may be scheduled by our site supervisor in order to quell any further disruptions or behavioral issues.
